active reading starts in the classroom and can be done with any text from science articles to biographies in history class to novels below are 11 ways to turn every student in your room into an active reader active reading strategies remember and analyze what you read choose the strategies that work best for you or that best suit your purpose ask yourself pre reading questions for example what is the topic and what do you already know about it why has the instructor assigned this reading at this point in the semester active reading encourages readers to ask questions make connections and summarize key points while engaging with the content it can also help enhance communication skills in particular by being able to articulate ideas and thoughts more clearly active reading is a reading comprehension strategy that helps students or other readers evaluate and remember key points in a text the more students are involved in the text and the active reading strategies choose the strategies that work best for you or that best suit your purpose ask yourself pre reading questions for example what is the topic and what do you already know about it why has the instructor assigned this reading at this point in the semester identify and define any unfamiliar terms skim the chapter reading only the chapter title subtitles italicized terms boldface type and introductory or summary sections make mental predictions about what you think the chapter will discuss active reading involves these steps preparing reading capturing the key ideas reviewing let's take a look at how to use each step when reading preparing to read start by thinking about why your instructor has chosen this text has the instructor said anything about the book or the author what is active reading it is easy to read an entire chapter out of a textbook and think i have no clue what i just read it takes effort to stay focused and engaged in your reading you can't just read that is a passive behavior you have to be active active reading involves deeper engagement with the text before during and after reading you can engage with the text by previewing it linking it with your experience asking and answering questions jotting down notes main ideas your ideas and more active reading techniques can help you stay focused and retain more information but it's a skill that takes time and effort to develop here are some strategies to help you get started right away 1 identify new words most of us develop a bad habit of glossing over words that are vaguely familiar to us often not even realizing we are doing so what is active reading active reading is a reading technique that requires readers to engage with the text actively to determine meaning and evaluate a text's relevance rather than passively absorbing information it requires readers to interact with the text by asking questions making connections and summarizing information active reading simply means reading something with a determination to understand and evaluate it for its relevance to your needs simply reading and re-reading the material isn't an effective way to understand and learn actively and critically engaging with the content can save you time active reading skills this chapter will help you practice strategies to read effectively and efficiently you will learn how to actively read by annotating answering pre reading questions doing quick research and discovering what a text has to say active reading involves deeper engagement with the text before during and after reading the reading lab promotes active reading by modeling strategies and techniques to support it a good way to understand active reading is by comparing it to what it is not what's sometimes called passive reading previous grumble applaud active reading includes highlighting annotating summarizing and being able to state in your own words what you have just read the goal is to improve your reading comprehension how can i start to read actively split your reading time into steps before during and after reading before reading an active reader listens to the text evaluating what the writer says checking to see if it matches or differs from his current understanding of the issue or idea he asks pertinent questions if something remains unclear looking for answers in subsequent sections of the text what is active reading active reading is distinguished from passive reading an activity where you read just to read by contrast the active reading process involves strategies these strategies may include mindset mental heuristics specific
